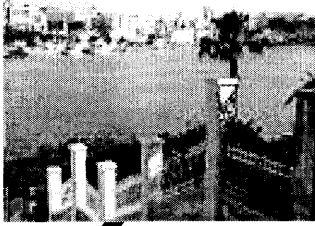


Brindisi, Italy

Brindisi is an ancient city in the Italian region of the Apulia. (located at the southern part of Italy)

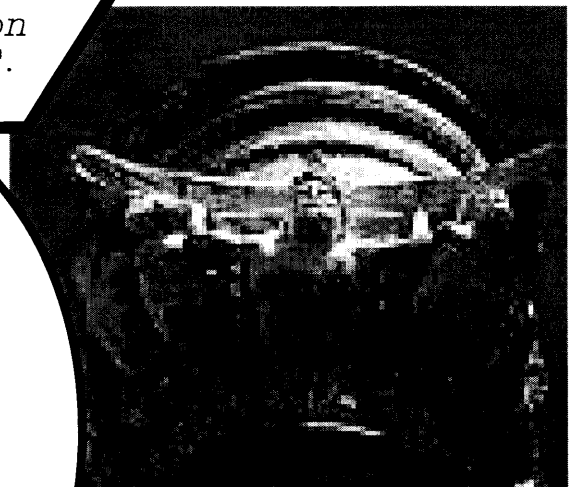
Surrounded by vineyards and artichoke fields, Brindisi is a major sailing port for the southern part of Italy.

Brindisi was founded by the legendary hero Diomedes. The Latin name *Brundisium*, through the Greek *Brentesion*, is a corruption of the Messapian *Brention* meaning "deer's head".

After the Punic Wars it became a major center of Roman naval power and maritime trade. In the Social War it received Roman citizenship, and was made a free port by Sulla.
